<p>Childline</p>	 <p><a href="#">Contacting Childline   Childline</a></p> <p>ONLINE, ON THE PHONE, ANYTIME <a href="http://childline.org.uk">childline.org.uk</a>   0800 1111</p>	<p>Childline is a service provided by the NSPCC and children can seek support about anything. ‘No problem is too big or too small.’</p> <p>Phone calls are free from landlines and mobiles and they do not show up on a phone bill; no credit is needed. Calls are not recorded and confidential – except in certain situations when: the child requests someone is told; the child or someone else is in danger; there is abuse by someone in a position of trust e.g. a teacher, sports coach, police officer etc; a child confides that another child is being hurt and is not able to tell or understand what is happening to them; Childline are told they have to by law e.g. in a court case.</p>
