






Spotting the signs of child sexual exploitation - YouTube</p>	<p>Criminal exploitation is when children are used by people, sometimes older or in gangs or groups, for criminal activity such as carrying or selling drugs or weapons, running money, involved in robberies or hiding things. Get Safe is the Worcestershire name for multi-agency support and protection for children and young people at risk of Criminal Exploitation. The Get Safe partnership (police, health, education, Children’s services and a range of voluntary services) is committed to tackling Child Exploitation and supporting victims and their families who experience this.</p> <p>Advice and support for parents and young people on a number of issues including Child Sexual Exploitation, Female Genital Mutilation, Trafficked Children.</p> <p>Department for Education – produce statutory guidance within which schools must operate. Guidance is aimed at keeping children safe and how this might be identified and managed.</p> <p>Parents Against Child Exploitation – support parents and carers whose children are being exploited by offenders outside of the family. They have information about Child Sexual Exploitation as well as Criminal Exploitation. A range of support is available for parents.</p> <p>The NSPCC offer a range of information and advice to protect and help children and young people.</p> <p>NWG are committed to the fight against CSE & wider exploitation and supporting victims and their families who are subjected to child exploitation.</p>

<p>Dangerous Drug Networks (DDN)</p>	 <p>County Lines - National Crime Agency</p>	<p>DDNs are drug dealing gangs who target vulnerable people in order to set up drugs distribution networks. These criminals are using extreme violence to establish a presence, displacing an existing drug supply chain and intimidating rivals, witnesses and victims, this has resulted in local murders. DDNs exploit vulnerable teenagers to become drug runners for their network. Early intervention and intelligence are key to safeguard and protect the vulnerable. CEOP helps keep children and young people safe from sexual abuse and grooming online. We help thousands of children and young people every year, as well as their parents and carers who have been in a similar situation to you. CEOP are unable to respond to reports about bullying, fake accounts or account hacking. CEOP are here to help and give advice, a report can be made directly to them if something has happened to your child online which has made either you or your child feel unsafe, scared or worried. This might be from someone they know in real life, or someone they have only ever met online. Reports can be made through the CEOP safety centre.</p>
