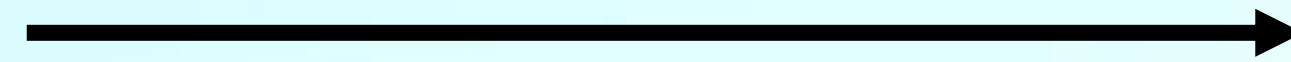

Are you entitled to assistance with school transport?

- Are you a Worcestershire resident?
- Do you live over 3 miles from the school?
- Is this your designated or nearest school?
- Do you live on an unavailable walking route if under 3 miles from your designated or nearest school?
 - Are you on low income (e.g. in receipt of Free School Meals)

Note – In shared catchment areas you are only entitled to the 'nearest school'

Note – You can request the walking route from your home to school is assessed if necessary

What if I am not entitled to transport assistance?

The County Council can sell:

- Local Bus Passes (Severn Cards) if you live on, or are near to a local bus route.
- Empty seats on our school coach services under our 'Vacant Seat Scheme' are reviewed each **October**.
- **Parents are reminded they must make alternative transport arrangements and continue with these arrangements until a seat is confirmed by the Transport Commissioning Team via phone or email.**

Things to Remember

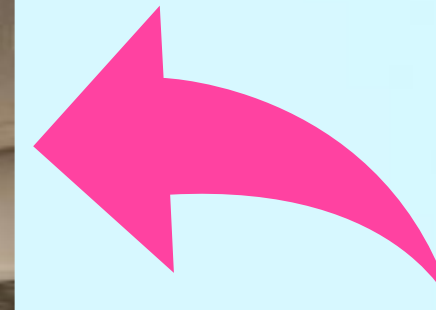
- **Students should carry their bus passes at all times** – Worcestershire operates a “No Pass, No Travel” policy on school transport services to prevent abuse.
- Children must be at their required stop 5 minutes before departure
- Don't worry if you haven't received a bus pass by the start of term. There is a two-week amnesty in September before “No Pass, No Travel” is implemented. You do not have to contact the team unless you are still without your bus pass post 22/09/2025
 - ***This does not apply to Local Bus services and all children must carry a bus pass from the start of term***
- If you think that you have received the wrong bus pass or have a general transport query, please complete an enquiry form on our website at: <https://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/schools-education-and-learning/school-and-college-travel/school-and-college-travel>
- Please submit your School Transport application as soon as possible and **no later than 30th June 2026**. We cannot guarantee that applications received after this time will be processed before the start of the Autumn Term.

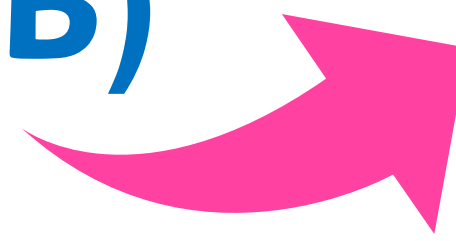

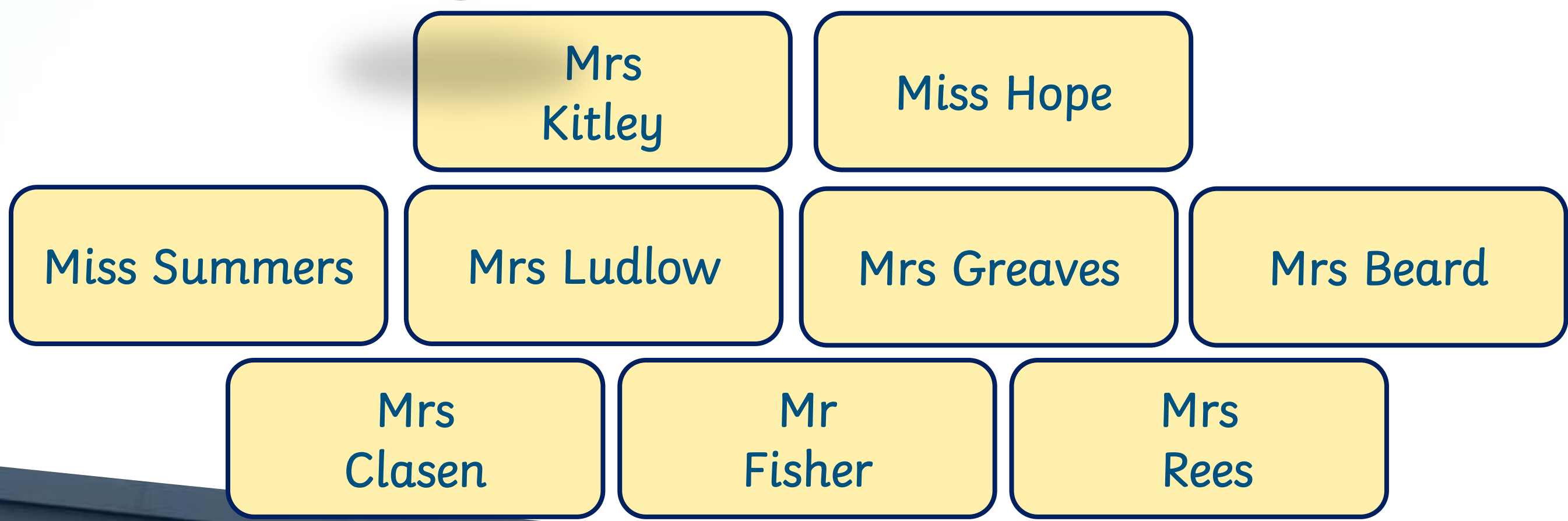

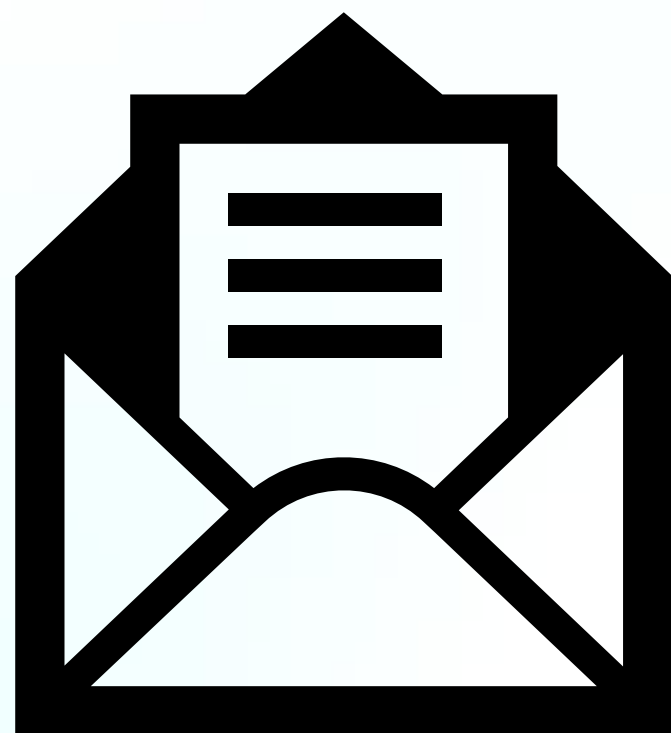
